 With 'difference', 'between' is used.
- If more than two things connected by 'and' then preposition between is used.
- Ex. India is situated between China, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Shrilanka.

In / Into


- Things or places which has boundaries or borders before it preposition in is used.

- If a book translated from one language to another language then preposition 'into' is used but names of language are mentioned one after another then preposition' to'is used.
- Ex. 1) Gectanjali is translated into many languages.
 - Translate this passage English to Marathi.
- 3) 'Out of' is opposite to 'into'
- Ex. 1) He took some books out of the bag.
 - 2) he came out of class.

In - is used after duration.

Within - is used before duration.

Ex. 1) I shall be back in a week.

2) I shall be back within a week.

<u>At</u>

- To mention exact time.
 - 1) I get up at 6 O'clock.
- Before small place 'at' is used and before big place 'in' is used.
 - 1) I live at Tirupati Nagar in Latur.
- Before exact age 'at' is used.
 - 1) He went to Pune at Sixteen.
- Value, rate, speed before these things preposition 'at' is used.
 - 1) Milk sells at Rs.22/- a liter.

- 5) Before some time showing words preposition 'at' is used:



- It is used in perfect continuous or perfect tense.

Ex. 1) He has been writing for 3 hours.

2) By 2019, they will have been building a bridge for 10 years





Ex. 1] I would die.I lied

Make a hay before the sun shines.


